



ALF Cañada Auxiliary of Professionals Awards Scholarships to Local Students

The Cañada Auxiliary of Professionals, known as CAP, has awarded four, \$1,000 scholarships to local high school graduates who are attending a two-year college or occupational program. CAP is an auxiliary of Assistance League of Flintridge (ALF). Two scholarship candidates and their families attended the September 18, 2019 CAP meeting, during which they were introduced to the organization's membership and the awards were presented.

The scholarship recipients include Clark Magnet High School graduate, Arsen Garabekyan. Arsen is a second year student at Glendale Community College, majoring in sociology. While in high school, Arsen participated in a program called, Jumpstart, which allowed him to be dually enrolled in college courses while still in high school. Arsen joined the Associated Students of GCC and served one semester as the Senator of Public Relations as well as the liaison between the students and the student body. Arsen also worked in the campus Welcome Center as a Student Ambassador. Arsen's career goal is to be a part of the local government in the city of Glendale.

Sophia James graduated from Crescenta Valley High School where she was Vice President of the Academy of Science and Medicine for 4 years. The Academy is an application-based, career pathway program for high-achieving students. Academy students take additional classes such as Biotechnology, Sports Medicine, EKG, etc. Sophia was also the president of the Pre-Med Society and was in the National Honor Society (NHS) for three years; the last year serving as its Vice President. During her senior year, Sophia was elected as the Glendale Unified School District Student Board Trustee, which is awarded to only one student in the entire Glendale Unified School District each year.
